# A Message from Our Director of Education, Domenic Scuglia



For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them. ~Matthew 18:20

When we gather to begin a school year, we believe and feel that we are in the presence of God. It is with God acknowledging each of our gifts that I welcome back all our staff, students, families and parishes for another exciting school year of blessings.

Over the summer break, I traveled with several students from our schools and their teacher Michelle Phair. The students were involved in a study of genocide and the Holocaust where they were eligible to earn a credit. The experience was life changing for each of us in so many ways. We travelled to Germany and Poland, visiting historic sites and former concentration camps such as Ravensbruck, Majdanek, Teblinka, Auschwitz-Birkenau. We each carried with us the name of a nine-year-old child who perished at Treblinka. Each child was remembered at our prayer service at Treblinka with a candle. I want to remember Lara Haskel – my nine-year-old child who I carried with me and is symbolic of all children who have perished through genocide or war. Our group prayed for those who perished because of hate and fear. We prayed for ourselves and for the future. We came home forever changed, and ready to focus on doing our own parts to ensure our world will have less hate in the future.

The theme this year is, once again, "Let Your Light Shine." Consider throughout the year that we should let our lights shine, not because we want others to see us, but because through us, we want others to see Him. We are asked to gather in His name, and we are tasked with spreading His word. Thank you to all of you for starting this year on a positive and faith-filled note.




#### **Our Leaders**

#### **Oueen of the Stars**

Miller Comprehensive Catholic High School student Jayda Delorme shared her art in Austria this summer. Along with body paint model and 2019 Miller graduate Mia Chartrand, Jayda's art, Queen of the Stars, was featured in the World Bodypainting Festival this past July. She competed in the amateur category, placing 24th out of 40 entries. Queen of the Stars was inspired by Sky Woman and the creation story as told by Jayda's ancestors. She had just 6 hours to create the artwork, then 60 second to explain her art to the judges. "When I paint I try to storytell and teach others about my culture," she says. "For the piece I did in Austria, I recreated the story of the sky creation story. I made it in a way that I could tell the judges what it means to me, who I am and where I come from. Every piece I do, I try to create a symbol or a story or something that has to do with my culture so I can educate others about it."
