SCSBA Appreciation Award Deacon Gil Bellevance

Gil has spent the entirety of his life serving the community. He was a dedicated Military member that served our country for 45 years. Gil also filled

the role as the Army Cadets Saskatchewan branch president for 20 years. For his great commitment and dedication to our community, Gil has received various awards: Queen Elizabeth Jubilee Medal and Minister of Veterans Affairs Commendation to name a few. He has been heavily involved in the Battlefords North West Historical Society, the Saskatchewan Baseball Hall of Fame and the North Saskatchewan Board of Governors of the Corps of Commissionaires.

Gil is a man of faith and has been a member and supporter of Saint André Apôtre Catholic Church for many years. He has served many years on the parish committee and the St. André Society, as well he is a long time Knights of Columbus member. Gil is an active volunteer within several parishes where he acts as a Deacon and performs lay mass at Villa Pascal and on reserves south of North Battleford. On his own time Gil also facilitates marriage and baptism preparation classes and weddings in local First Nations communities.

As a man of God, Gil shares his knowledge and wisdom of the Catholic faith with both students and teachers. At Saint Mary's, Gil meets with each class to help them prepare for their monthly masses. He provides valuable service by teaching students regarding parts of the mass and the significance of its elements. Gil is a great support to the teachers by helping assist students in reading skills providing one –on-one interaction and furthering their knowledge of Catholic practices and beliefs. He supports the families in our community by ministering in the Battlefords, and in First Nations communities, and arranging sacraments for immediate and extended family members.

The sheer number of hours Gil has spent in Saint Mary's school, Notre Dame Parish, St. André Parish, Villa Pascal, the Cadet program, various boards around the community, ministering to outlying First Nations communities, etc. – not to mention his military service to our country – show how a Catholic man can live with integrity in every aspect of his life. He lives every moment of his life in service to others, never with bravado or boastfulness. Gil shows how small acts of service, prayer, and compassion can add up to a rich life and an even richer community.



SCSBA Appreciation Award Laurie Makichuk

Laurie has been committed to Catholic Education as a trustee for 23 years. She has served as Vice Chair and Chair of LCSD. She served as a Director on

SCSBA and was also part of the Communications Committee.

Laurie's commitment to faith involves her entire life. She and her husband, Dusty, have raised three daughters in a Catholic home and they were educated in the Catholic system. Two of Laurie's girls now teach in LCSD. Laurie is now watching her two grandchildren walk the halls of schools she has nurtured for more than two decades.

In her tenure, the school division has more than doubled in size from 1,320 students to over 2,900. This growth is a credit to the leadership and vision of Trustees.

Laurie is passionate and dedicated to ensuring all students have the opportunity to learn in a Catholic School. She makes time to attend as many school events as possible. She runs curling clinics at the elementary schools and coaches curling at the high school. She is a constant presence not just cheering on our students at competition but also celebrating their successes in the Arts and Community Volunteering.

Recently, Laurie developed a bee inquiry learning project for Kindergarten, alongside our Kindergarten teachers. \She welcomes more than 250 students into her yard as they learn, paint, colour, decorate cookies, and dress up in beekeeping outfits to see first hand how a hive works. In this Bee Day lie the lessons of stewardship for the environment and how a community can act together in common purpose to better our world. Laurie does not just ask how we can save the bees but also has children consider how saving the bees is part of what God asks us to do.

Laurie's lessons are not just a weekday affair. She is a central figure in the life of St. Anthony's Parish. She has served during mass and helped with children's liturgy. Most recently she has organized an annual multicultural night that celebrates the diversity in our parish. Laurie brings the children of our Parish into the hearts and minds of those who may not have children in school. In promoting this understanding, Laurie is a key connector to how everyone can be involved in raising the children of our community.

Wherever Laurie goes she promotes the importance and the gift that is Catholic Education. SCSBA holds a warm place in her heart. A special appreciation and recognition for Twylla and Derrick who have been invaluable in their work to support and provide advice to the SCSBA with regard to the Theodore Appeal. 
The school division would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge George for all he has done to support our students. His influence and his efforts with the Board of Education can be directly felt across our schools today.

Julian Paslawski Meritorious Service Award Bishop Albert Thévenot, M. Afr.

Bishop Albert was born in 1945 in Treherne, Manitoba. His parents shared and instilled their strong faith in all twelve children including the virtues of charity and love that drive his support of our division and catholic education to this day. Bishop Albert began his path to the priesthood in 1964 by joining the Missionaries in Africa, known as the White Fathers. It was the beginning of his service to the church and youth. Ordained in 1980 he continued his calling in Africa, Western Canada, and Rome.

Since he became Bishop of the Diocese of Prince Albert in 2008, Bishop Albert has worked tirelessly in the name of the church and Catholic schools, especially (at least we think so) his favourite division, Light of Christ Catholic Schools.

Bishop Albert is a stalwart supporter of both the right and need for Catholic education.
