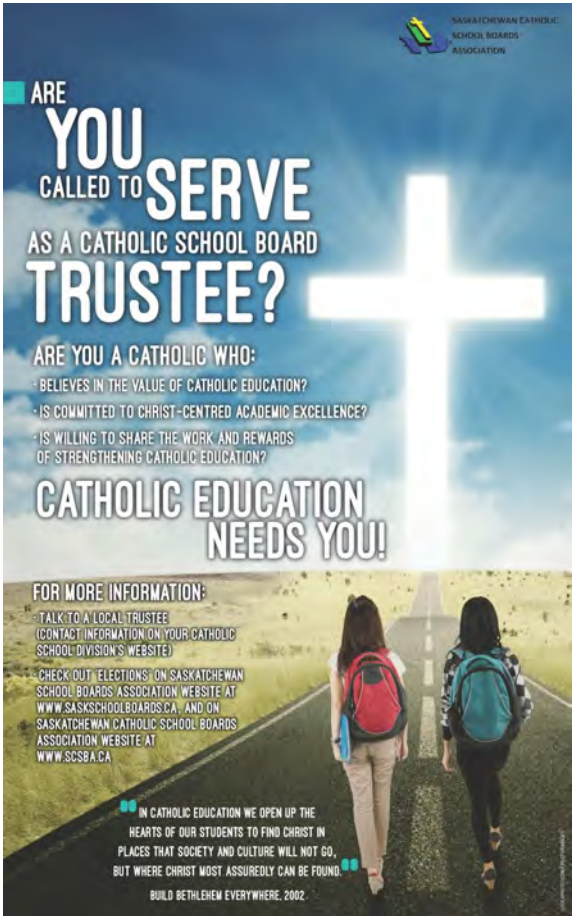
School Board Elections
