

Introduction

The purpose of permeation is to make our faith part of every lesson we teach. It is the sharing of our core religious values with our students. We look for authentic ways to share our faith.

Permeating Faith Through Connections to Religion Class

Faith permeation can include making connections between current Religious Education programming and other subject areas. The *Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ* program is divided into five units over the course of the year, corresponding to the seasons of the Liturgical Year.

- Unit 1 Ordinary Time (September November)
- Unit 2 Advent and Christmas (December early January)
- Unit 3 Ordinary Time (January February)
 - End of unit depends on when Lent begins
- Unit 4 Lent and Easter (approximately mid-February through late March)
 - o Start and end date depend on when Lent begins and Easter is celebrated
- Unit 5 Easter Season and Ordinary Time (April June)
 - o Start date depends on when Easter is celebrated

Grade 1 Religion Outcomes

This short summary outlines what students will be learning in Religious Education programming over the course of the year.

Unit 1 – I Am A Child of God

Examine our relationship with God and determine how that relationship affects our interactions with others and God's creation.

Unit 2 – The Road to Bethlehem

Explore the seasons of Advent and Christmas and the related stories, symbols and traditions.

Unit 3 – My Life in Jesus

Examine the teaching and ministry of Jesus and the call to life in the Church through baptism.

Unit 4 – The Story of Lent

Explore the seasons of Lent and Easter and the related stories, symbols and traditions.

Unit 5 – Jesus is With Us Always

Recognize the compassion of Jesus and describe how He is always with us through the Holy Spirit.



Grade 1 Religion Outcomes – Unit One

Outcome 1.1

Examine our relationship with God and determine how that relationship affects our interactions with others and God's creation.

Overview of Unit 1: I Am a Child of God

- Introduces students to God as Creator and Father.
- Within the unit, they will learn about God's covenant with Noah and Abraham.
- They will read about the call of Moses, and God's love for His Chosen People.
- They will learn about God's call to personal holiness by exploring the stories of some saints.

- Demonstrate an understanding of the Bible (i.e. Word of God) as the inspired story of the Revelation of God (i.e. Plan of Loving Goodness) that unfolds in stages and finds its fullest expression in Christ Jesus. [CCC 50–73; 456–682]
- Demonstrate how in the Scriptures, the people gradually came to know God as "Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and Earth". [CCC 50–73; 101–104; 142–184; 198–354; 422–682]

Grade 1 Religion Outcomes – Unit Two

Outcome 1.2

Explore the seasons of Advent and Christmas and the related stories, symbols and traditions.

Overview of Unit 2: The Road to Bethlehem

- The Road to Bethlehem presents the seasons of Advent and Christmas through story and Scripture.
- Students will focus on Advent as a time of waiting and anticipation of the birth of the Son of God.
- Through Scripture, they will learn that Mary became a willing participant in the story of salvation and, as an obedient servant of God, becomes a model for us.
- The story of the Nativity is related as God's perfect gift to humankind.

- Demonstrate an understanding of the Bible (i.e. Word of God) as the inspired story of the Revelation of God (i.e. Plan of Loving Goodness) that unfolds in stages and finds its fullest expression in Christ Jesus. [CCC 50–73; 456–682]

Outcome 1.3

• Examine the teaching and ministry of Jesus and the call to life in the Church through baptism.

Overview of Unit 3: My Life in Jesus

- Based in Ordinary Time and focuses on Baptism as a call to life in the Church.
- Students will read about the ministry and life of Jesus through such stories as the wedding at Cana, Jesus feeding the 5000, and Jesus and the leper.
- They will explore the lives of saints who endeavoured to live their lives as Jesus taught.

- Demonstrate an understanding of the Church as a people who are formed into a believing community by God's Word (i.e. Scripture inspired story of Jesus Christ). [CCC 101–141; 748–975]
- Focus: Baptism Understand that the Church celebrates our life in Christ and the Church through sacraments. [CCC 1211–1284]

Overview of Unit 4: The Story of Lent and Easter

- Grounded in Scripture, these lessons will help students to begin to understand the story of our salvation.

Overview of Unit 5: Jesus Is Always with Us

- Is based in Ordinary Time and focuses on the call to live our lives as Jesus taught.
- Through the stories of the risen Christ, students will come to know that Jesus has promised to maintain and strengthen us through the Eucharist and the Holy Spirit.
- Students will once again see Mary, the Mother of Jesus, as the Mother of all and a model of perfect holiness.
