

Introduction

The purpose of permeation is to make our faith part of every lesson we teach. It is the sharing of our core religious values with our students. We look for authentic ways to share our faith.

Permeating Faith Through Connections to Religion Class

Faith permeation can include making connections between current Religious Education programming and other subject areas. The *Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ* program is divided into five units over the course of the year, corresponding to the seasons of the Liturgical Year.

- Unit 1 Ordinary Time (September November)
- Unit 2 Advent and Christmas (December early January)
- Unit 3 Ordinary Time (January February)
 - End of unit depends on when Lent begins
- Unit 4 Lent and Easter (approximately mid-February through late March)
 - Start and end date depend on when Lent begins and Easter is celebrated
- Unit 5 Easter Season and Ordinary Time (April June)
 - o Start date depends on when Easter is celebrated

Grade 3 Religion Outcomes

This short summary outlines what students will be learning in Religious Education programming over the course of the year.

Grade 3 Religion Outcomes – Unit One

Outcome 3.1 Examine what it means to be part of the Catholic community.

Key concepts:

- Jesus' life teaches us to live and love within our Catholic community
- Mary helps us live in community
- The saints are models for our Catholic community
- Our choices and actions impact our community.

Overview of Unit 1: Our Catholic Community

- In this unit students will explore what it means to be part of the Catholic community.
- They look at what the life of Jesus teaches us about community and how Mary's example helps us live in and strengthen our faith community.
- They will explore the lives of saints and how they are models for the Catholic community.
- Students will also be introduced to God's gift of free will and how their own choices and actions affect their community.

Faith Content

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Grade 3 Religion Outcomes – Unit Two

Outcome 3.2 Examine how we can share the message of Advent and Christmas with others.

Key understandings:

- God promised to send us the Messiah.
- Mary's obedience teaches us to trust in God's promise.
- God sent His own Son to be our Saviour.
- God shares His Son with everyone and calls us all to spread the Good News.

Overview of Unit 2: The Road to Bethlehem

- Presents the seasons of Advent and Christmas through story and scripture.
- Students will explore the meaning of Advent and Christmas and how they can share the Good News with others.
- They will be introduced to the prophets, who revealed God's promise to send a Messiah, and they will understand how the birth of Jesus was the fulfillment of the prophecies.
- They will learn more about the ancestors of Jesus through the Jesse Tree.
- They will also be introduced to missionaries and begin to understand how they can be missionaries in their own communities.

Grade 3 Religion Outcomes – Unit Three

Outcome 3.3 Explore how the Holy Spirit guides us to be a witness to Christ's mission in the world.

Key concepts:

- The Holy Spirit is always with us, at work in our lives.
- The gifts of the Holy Spirit bring us closer to God and one another.
- We are guided by the Holy Spirit when we use God's gift of free choice.
- The Holy Spirit unites us as the Body of Christ.

Overview of Unit 3: Born of the Spirit

- Based in Ordinary Time and focuses on how the Holy Spirit is revealed to us through the scriptures and the sacraments.
- Students will learn that we are strengthened through the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit and how our actions and words reveal that the Holy Spirit is at work in our lives.
- They will also begin to understand that we are members of the Body of Christ.
- As the Body of Christ, with the help of the Holy Spirit, we are called to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.
- Students will also be introduced to people, saints, and Catholic agencies whose lives and actions are examples of our mission as members of the Body of Christ.

Grade 3 Religion Outcomes – Unit Four

Outcome 3.4 Investigate what the death and resurrection of Jesus tells us about God's mercy.

Key concepts:

- Lent teaches us about Jesus' sacrifice and our call to sacrifice.
- We hurt our relationship with God when we do not follow His guidance. God shows us His mercy and forgiveness whenever we repent for our sins.
- The Paschal Mystery teaches us about God's gift of eternal life in Heaven.

Overview of Unit 4: Our Lenten Journey

- Students will review and build on Lenten topics covered in previous grades in preparation for Easter.
- They will recall that Lent is a season of repentance and that, as followers of Christ, we are called to confess our sins and ask for forgiveness.
- Through this unit, students will begin to understand the difference between mortal and venial sin, and between personal and social sin.
- They will grow in their understanding of how sin can affect our relationship with God and how to reconcile relationships with God and others through the sacrament of Reconciliation and personal acts of atonement.
- The emphasis in the unit is on God's mercy.

Grade 3 Religion Outcomes – Unit Five

Outcome 3.5: Identify how the Holy Spirit helps us to carry out Christ's mission in the world through our words and actions.

Key concepts:

- The Holy Spirit inspires us to follow Jesus. Through His gifts, the Holy Spirit strengthens us, intercedes for us, and makes us holy.
- The Holy Spirit is present in the liturgy of the Church.
- Through the power of the Holy Spirit, Mary became Mother of the Church.
- We witness Jesus through our actions as members of the Body of Christ.

Overview of Unit : The Promise of the Holy Spirit

- Students will learn about the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to send an Advocate.
- Through an examination of scripture, they will learn about the events of Pentecost and the origins of the Church.
- They will explore how the Holy Spirit unites us as members of the Church and inspires us to fulfill Christ's mission.
- This unit emphasizes participation in Christ's mission through participation in the liturgies and outreach of the Church.
- Students will also explore devotions to Mary. They will learn that Mary is the first disciple and understand more about Mary's role as the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church.
