

Introduction

The purpose of permeation is to make our faith part of every lesson we teach. It is the sharing of our core religious values with our students. We look for authentic ways to share our faith.

Permeating Faith Through Connections to Religion Class

Faith permeation can include making connections between current Religious Education programming and other subject areas. The *Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ* program is divided into five units over the course of the year, corresponding to the seasons of the Liturgical Year.

- Unit 1 Ordinary Time (September November)
- Unit 2 Advent and Christmas (December early January)
- Unit 3 Ordinary Time (January February)
 - o End of unit depends on when Lent begins
- Unit 4 Lent and Easter (approximately mid-February through late March)
 - o Start and end date depend on when Lent begins and Easter is celebrated
- Unit 5 Easter Season and Ordinary Time (April June)
 - o Start date depends on when Easter is celebrated

Grade 2 Religion Outcomes

This short summary outlines what students will be learning in Religious Education programming over the course of the year.

Unit 1 – We Belong to God's Family

Examine what it means to belong to God's family and the special characteristics of that membership.

Unit 2 – The Road to Bethlehem

Explore the seasons of Advent and Christmas through scripture passages and how we live the seasons in our homes.

Unit 3 -Jesus Guides Us

Examine how Jesus guides us on our faith journey through sharing God's word, loving one another, celebrating God's blessings, and living as he wants us to live.

Grade 2 Religion Outcomes – Unit Two

Outcome 2.2: Explore the seasons of Advent and Christmas through scripture passages and how we live the seasons in our homes.

Overview of Unit Two: The Road to Bethlehem

- Presents the seasons of Advent and Christmas through story and Scripture.
- Students will explore the meaning of Advent by recalling the Annunciation and revisiting the Hail Mary, focusing on its meaning and how we receive the grace of God.
- They will learn about the joy of the coming of the Messiah and the fulfillment of the promise of salvation through the birth of Jesus as the perfect gift of love from God.

Grade 2 Religion Outcomes – Unit Three

Overview of Unit Three: Jesus Guides Us

- Based in Ordinary Time and focuses on events in the life of Jesus.
- Students will read some healing stories of Jesus and understand that He continues to heal and protect people today though the sacraments.
