On behalf of the students, staff, and Board of Education of Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools, we pray you have a blessed Easter.


Schools will be closed from Good Friday (April 15) through Friday, April 22 for Easter Break. Classes will resume Monday, April 25th.


Invitational Shared Services Initiative

On Thursday, March 24th members from Christ the Teacher School Board and Division office (CTTCS) attended the Invitational Shared Services Initiative (ISSI) signing ceremony at Goose Lake School on the Zagime Anishinabek First Nation. The ISSI program is a Ministry of Education funded program to support the improvement of education outcomes for First Nations and Métis Students. This signing ceremony marks the beginning of a partnership among Goose Lake School, St. Mary's School, and Dreambuilders High School, that will address the need of equal learning opportunities for all students and enrich students with FNM culture, language, and ways of learning. Members from the Ministry of Education and CTTCS had the privilege of opening this new partnership with a Pipe Ceremony, Feast, and tour of the Goose Lake School (pictured below and right).








Indigenous Delegation to Rome

Each day, activities and themes intended to deepen student understanding of aspects of "Rebuild, Restore, Renew Together" will take place.




Sacred Heart High School Drama


Dreambuilders High School Winter Camp
