### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A B.Ed. degree or undergraduate degree plus a teaching certificate is required for admission. Applicants with a Bachelor's degree plus work experience in an educational setting may be considered.

### PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

- Pay the application fee via the application web page.
- Arrange for your official transcripts to be sent from all post-secondary institutions.
- Submit two letters of reference.
- Write a Letter of Intent about why you wish to study for the M.R.E.

### PROGRAM DELIVERY

New students are able to join the Saskatchewan MRE cohort every July. The program offers three courses per calendar year: one course in the winter term, an intensive course in July, and one course in the fall term. The program takes approximately three years to complete.
