It is with a grateful and humble heart that I reflect on my 36-year career dedicated to Catholic education in the community of Yorkton. For the past 16 years, I have served as the Religious Education Consultant for Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools, following 20 years of classroom teaching. In addition to my consultant role, I've had the privilege of teaching the *Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ* program to elementary school students, and Catholic Studies 30 at Sacred Heart High School. Both have been deeply rewarding experiences as I near the end of my career.

Although I attended public school, my passion for Catholic education was ignited during my internship at St. Paul's School in Yorkton in 1988. This experience affirmed my calling, transforming what began as a profession into a vocation. I was blessed to start my teaching career at the same school in 1989, and I've remained committed to Catholic education ever since. My school division and my parish of St. Gerard are cherished extensions of my family, where I've been fortunate to serve both in education and spiritual ministry. Over the years, I've served in a variety of ministries, most currently as our CWL President and a member of the parish's vision team.

In my role as Religious Education Consultant, I've been involved with CECAS since its inception, and I've had the privilege of reviewing faith education programs and contributing to the development of Catholic Studies curricula. My passion for deepening my understanding of the faith led me to complete the Archdiocese of Regina's Lay Formation Program in 2009 and a Master of Religious Education through Newman Theological College in 2017.

Throughout my career, I've found fulfillment in sharing my faith with others, continually learning, and contributing to the mission of Catholic education. It has been a blessing to have my career shaped by the values of Catholic education making it a true vocation.

I am deeply honoured to be recognized by the SCSBA, and I thank my family, colleagues, and friends who have supported me throughout this journey. May we walk in God's grace always!

SCSBA Julian Paslawski Meritorious Service Award

Beginning in 1982, this award was simply called the Meritorious Service Award. It honours individuals who have made a highly significant contribution to Catholic Education in the Province of Saskatchewan. In 2006, it was re-named the Julian Paslawski Meritorious Service Award to honour the outstanding service of long-time Saskatchewan Catholic School Boards Association (SCSBA) Executive Director Julian Paslawski. He began his tenure in 1987 and continued his service until his retirement in 2007. During that time, he guided the association through enormous changes to education in the Province of Saskatchewan.

He facilitated the amalgamation of Catholic divisions from more than 20 to the eight divisions we have today. Along the way he supported the formation of a number of new Catholic school divisions prior to their later amalgamation with larger divisions. He coordinated the incorporation of the Catholic Section of the Saskatchewan School Boards Association into the SCSBA in 2006. His work maintaining relationships with politicians and bureaucrats was legendary. He was awarded the 1998 Meritorious Service Award and in 2008 he received the Canadian Catholic School Trustees' Association's highest honour, the Justice James Higgins Award, for outstanding leadership in Catholic Education in Canada.

Gwen deeply understood the need for a strong Catholic voice with respect to our reconciliation journey. She was a passionate steward of Catholic Education while keeping positive relationships with Public Boards.

Gwen has mentored educational leaders both provincially and nationally. As a female senior administrator in education, Gwen continues to support and guide women in leadership roles, both personally and professionally. Gwen's stewardship to being a servant leader is well known to all those who encountered her.

Gwen is a founding member of RaiseHER Community with her daughter and another mother daughter duo, a for impact intergenerational movement that recognizes the shared challenges facing women and girls. RaiseHER Community aims to create opportunities for guidance, leadership, collaboration and insightful conversation to empower women and girls to realize their potential.
